English: Writing

Greedy:

I would like you to find out about rats and what their homes are like. Does a rats home have a particular name? Eg rabbits live in warrens.

Compound sentences separated by a colon. Remember the first part of the sentence gives information and the second part adds extra detail. If it is a clause it **must have a verb**. This means both parts of the sentence need a verb.
