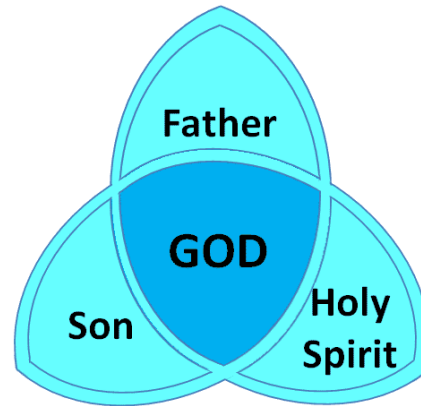


Ospreys Class Autumn 2019 RE topics: Christianity—What is Trinity?



By the end of this topic we will...

- Know what the Trinity is
- Be able to identify the difference between a 'Gospel', which tells the story of the life and teaching of Jesus Christ, and a letter
- Be able to give examples of what these texts mean to some Christians today
- Be able to offer suggestions about what baptism and Trinity texts might mean
- Be able to describe how Christians show their beliefs about God the Trinity in worship and in the way they live
- Be able to make links between some bible texts studied and the idea of God in Christianity, expressing clearly some ideas of their own about what the God of Christianity is like

Gospel	The teaching or revelation of Christ
Trinity	Christians believe in one God in three parts: God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit
Baptism	A Christian ceremony where water is poured on someone's head or they are immersed in water, as a sign that they have become Christian.
Christening	A Christian ceremony in which a person is accepted into the Christian church and is given a name.
Worship	To express your love and devotion to God or a god.
Christian	A religion based on the teachings of Jesus Christ.
Prayer	Christians believe that by praying, they can talk to God.
Holy Spirit	Christians believe the Holy Spirit is the part of God who is here on earth.
Incarnation	Jesus is God in the flesh and through Jesus, God came to live among us.
