Angles	Came from Germany
Saxons	Came from northern and central Germany
Jutes	Came from Jutland (Germany & Southern Denmark)
Scots	People from Ireland who eventually settled in Scotland
Picts	Ancient tribes from northern Scotland
Vortogern	The British King left in charge after the Romans left
Hengest & Horsa	Brothers from Jutland who helped Vortogern fight for Britain
Tiw	Anglo-Saxon God of war
Woden	The King of the Anglo-Saxon Gods
Thuno	God of thunder
Frige	Goddess of love
Eostre	Goddess of spring
Romans	Ruled Britain for about 400 years but left in around 410 AD
