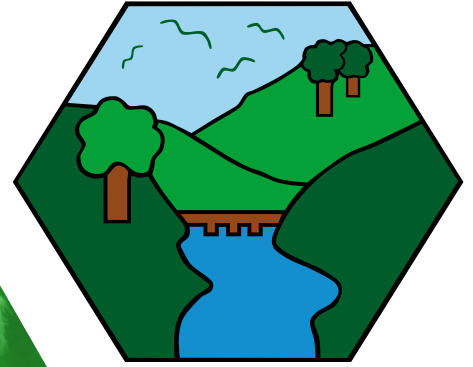

SIAMS and OFSTED

In 2020 By Brook was assessed by SIAMS (Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools) and received an overall judgment of excellent in relation to the question ‘How effective is the school’s distinctive Christian vision, established and promoted by leadership at all levels, in enabling pupils and adults

Grade 1	Outstanding	An outstanding school is highly effective in delivering outcomes that provide exceptionally well for all its pupils’ needs. This ensures that pupils are very well equipped for the next stage of their education, training or employment.

Our school

Our school, based in the village of Yatton Keynell, has welcomed children from the surrounding villages of Biddestone, Nettleton and Burton and Castle Combe since 1998. We became an Academy in 2012 and then extended in 2014 to meet an increasing demand for places. Today, across our seven classes we have over 190 pupils, aged between 4 and 11 years of age, taught in single year group classes.

The classrooms are linked by a bright corridor which houses the school library and provides a dedicated space for group work activities. Our music room is well used for instrumental lessons and the school hall, fully equipped for gymnastics, is also used as a space where the whole school can gather for collective worship, assemblies and performances.

Space to play and learn

Our picturesque grounds include a large playing field, a wrap-around playground, a small woodland area and play apparatus. Our peace and prayer garden provide children with a quiet space they can reflect and find peace. Through cultivating our vegetable garden and orchard children learn more about where their food comes from and how to stay healthy. Our pond and wildlife area create an ideal space for studying insects and animals in their natural habitats.

Fit for life and fit for learning

We want our children to be active and to enjoy physical activity. All our pupils have two PE lessons every week and over the year will engage in dance, games, gymnastics, yoga and athletics. Year 4 also go swimming every week. In addition to this, during the week, the children take part in running outside for 10 minutes, as part of 'The Daily Mile' initiative and enjoy 'Wake and Shake', led by our pupil sports leaders.

Over the year, we ensure that every child takes part in a sporting festival or tournament with other local primary schools and can compete in a range of track and field events for their respective houses (Yatton Keynell, Biddestone, Nettleton and Burton and Castle Combe) at our annual school sports day. These events help the children to experience the more competitive aspects of sport.

Enrichment

There are many opportunities for pupils to grow in confidence at By Brook Valley. We are proud of our music and performance tradition. Every year, all children have the opportunity to perform, on stage, to their families.

The children also share their learning during class assemblies and through the learning of languages.

Our curriculum is enriched through visits, both day and residential, and through visitors who are experts in their field, coming into school to work alongside staff and children.

Beyond the School Day

We offer a diverse range of extra-curricular opportunities and clubs which are planned on a term by term basis.

We are able to offer our families breakfast club from 7.45am and after-school club until 5.45pm (5pm on a Friday) where children can have fun and are cared for at either end of the school day.

Teaching and learning

Our broad and balanced curriculum is built on our vision of “Roots to Grow and Wings to Fly” and underpinned by our Christian core values of Hope, Honesty, Forgiveness and Friendship and reflects the needs of our community. Our curriculum gives pupils the confidence, knowledge, skills and learning behaviours to allow them to be successful and flourish now and in the future so that they can make a positive and unique contribution to the world.

We aim to:

- Value every child, respecting and celebrating each one as unique through our core values, adapting and personalising the learning, high quality personal, relationship, social and health education; and high quality religious education in line with our Christian foundation.
- Encourage and develop the joy of learning in all children through being creative, vibrant and engaging in our approaches to teaching and learning.
- Develop curiosity and deepen understanding through use of ‘big questions’ so that pupils can demonstrate their new knowledge and deeper understanding.
- Provide high quality, enriching and engaging experiences to enable pupils to grow and develop personally, creatively, physically and academically, as individuals and within a variety of relationships. We aim to link learning within and across the curriculum and different aspects of school life.
- Develop knowledge and skills as pupils make their journey through their primary school education, enabling pupils to integrate new learning and build on prior knowledge and understanding.
- Root learning in real world, first-hand and relevant experiences through providing quality, well – planned and purposeful activities and experiences, in and outside of the classroom, within the school grounds, the local community and within the wider world.
- Promote the importance of reading and ensure that it is a central part in all teaching and learning. We use high quality texts and a range of genres to challenge pupils, extend their vocabulary and understanding of language so they can apply it across all areas of learning.



Cultivating a love of learning

Teaching is not something we do to the children: we encourage them to be active participants, solving problems, developing independent skills and learning about themselves as learners. We embrace the era of new technology and integrate digital learning tools into teaching and learning in our classrooms. In this way we equip our pupils with the skills that will not only enable them to be successful in academic terms, but also enable them to face new challenges or uncertainty with confidence.

Capturing imaginations

We believe that each child is unique and should have the care and support to reach their potential and become independent learners. Our highly skilled and dedicated teaching team impart an excitement and a joy of learning – capturing imaginations and stimulating children's curiosity and their capacity to learn.

The whole curriculum provides opportunities for all pupils to understand, respect and celebrate difference and diversity.

Ways we communicate with parents

Regular communication between home and school is a vital part of our partnership with parents/carers.

Parent – Teacher Meetings

Twice a year there is the opportunity for parents to meet with the class teacher to discuss their child's achievements, progress and next steps.

Attainment and progress reports

A full written report is sent home to parents following the Easter break. Information is also shared with parents at the end of the academic year.

Linger and learn

Throughout the year there are opportunities for you to stay at the beginning of the day or join your child's class in the afternoon to share their learning.

Fortnightly, we send a newsletter out to families containing key dates, school information, forthcoming events and other items of interest relating to school life.

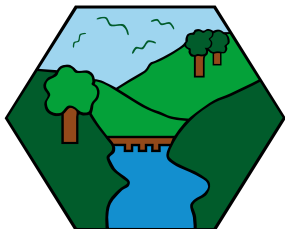
