### Key Vocabulary

<b>Village</b>	A group of houses and other buildings that is smaller than a town, usually in the countryside.
<b>Town</b>	A place where people live and work, containing many houses, shops, places of work, places of entertainment. Usually larger than a village but smaller than a city.
<b>City</b>	Any town in the UK that has a cathedral.
<b>Rural</b>	In, of, or like the countryside.
<b>North</b>	The direction that goes towards the part of the earth above the equator. The direction in which a compass needle normally points.
<b>South</b>	The direction that goes towards the part of the earth below the equator, opposite to the north.
<b>East</b>	The direction from which the sun rises in the morning, opposite to the west.
<b>West</b>	The direction in which the sun goes down in the evening, opposite to the east.
<b>Poles</b>	The two points at the most northern and most southern ends of the earth, around which the earth turns.
<b>Equator</b>	An imaginary line drawn around the middle of the earth an equal distance from the North Pole and the South Pole.
<b>Continent</b>	Any of the world's main continuous expanses of land (Europe, Asia, Africa, North and South America, Australia, Antarctica).
<b>Ocean</b>	A very large area of sea.
